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## **1. QUEENSLAND - JUNIOR ROOKIE SQUAD (JRS) OBJECTIVES**

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1.1 The objective of JRS is to:

- 1.1.1 Develop and promote pistol shooting to all junior members and the community, particularly through the shooting media and competitions.
- 1.1.2 Provide discipline and instructions on safety and firearms handling
- 1.1.3 Provide coordinated coaching, direction and motivation through support and Squad Camps on behalf of Queensland Amateur Pistol Shooting Association (QAPSA).
- 1.1.4 Provide assistance in developing potential members for inclusion to the Queensland State Development Squad (QSDS).

## **2. JRS MANAGEMENT**

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2.1 JRS Management shall consist of: -

2.1.1 Co-ordinator – (ISSF) This position to be appointed by the QAPSA Board and shall be for a term of up to three (3) years. Each year of appointment shall be from 1 October to 30 September.

2.1.1.1 The position is to be advertised by QAPSA and appointed by the Board at the nearest QAPSA Board meeting preceding commencement period of the position (refer 2.1.1)

2.1.1.2 The position is to be reviewed annually by the Board at the nearest QAPSA Board meeting preceding commencement of the position (refer 2.1.1)

2.1.1.3 The Co-ordinator's position must comply with the following;

(a) hold a Category "H" Licence.

(b) hold a Queensland working with children "Blue Card" .

(c) hold a minimum of Pistol Australia Inc (PAI) Level 1 Coach accreditation.

2.1.2 QAPSA State Coaching Director

2.1.3 QAPSA Management Committee.

2.2 JRS Management responsibilities:

2.2.1 Co-ordinator – refer, clause 9 'Co-ordinator – Junior Rookie Squad (JRS) Charter.

2.2.2 QAPSA State Coaching Director - Assist and provide advice to the JRS Co-ordinator when requested, in consultation with QAPSA Management Committee.

2.2.3 QAPSA Management Committee – Oversee and be the approving body of activities undertaken by the JRS Co-ordinator and JRS Members.

### 3. JRS FINANCE

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- 3.1 JRS finances will be provided by the following:
  - 3.1.1 QAPSA (within a means of a budget)
  - 3.1.2 JRS Membership Fee (refer clause 4.6)
  - 3.1.3 JRS Camp Registration Fees refer clause 5.1.1 (when applicable)
  - 3.1.4 Other sources eg. Fundraising, Sponsorship, Grants etc.
- 3.2 JRS Finances will go towards:
  - 3.2.1 JRS apparel (within a means of a budget and as agreed by QAPSA Management)
  - 3.2.2 Assistance toward cost of QAPSA approved JRS Training/Coaching camps.(within a means of a budget)

### 4. JRS ELIGIBILITY

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- 4.1 Membership to JRS shall be for the period from 1 October to 30 September each squad year.
- 4.2 Entry to JRS may be gained by meeting the following criteria:
  - 4.2.1 JRS members must be a minimum of 11 years old and under 21 years of age. *(The year of turning 21 years old a member will cease to be eligible for JRS)*
  - 4.2.2 JRS members under 18 years of age must have parental/guardian consent to nominate or accept invitation to JRS. Refer Appendix A - Consent Form.
  - 4.2.3 JRS members must be affiliated to Queensland Amateur Pistol Shooting Association.
  - 4.2.4 JRS members must have a current Queensland Firearms category “H” Licence or “Minors Licence”, however a Junior not having the above may still join JRS as a member providing;
    - (a) The process to obtain category “H” Licence or “Minors Licence has commenced. (Must be verified by the JRS Co-ordinator)
  - 4.2.5 JRS members must have shot an eligibility score (refer clause 4.2.6) at least once prior to joining each squad year. Eligibility score must be shot in an official Club Competition or higher in either Junior Sport Pistol or Junior Air Pistol
  - 4.2.6 JRS Eligibility Scores for members will be:

(a)	Sport Pistol	Junior Male	Minimum score of	420
(b)	Sport Pistol	Junior Female	Minimum score of	380
(c)	Air Pistol	Junior Male	Minimum score of	420
(d)	Air Pistol	Junior Female	Minimum score of	280

- 4.2.7 JRS Eligibility Scores shot must be verified and endorsed by Club Scorers, Club Secretary or one of the JRS Management members prior to joining. Refer Nomination form Appendix E.
- 4.2.8 One (1) eligibility score in one (1) event only is required for eligibility to JRS, however members may nominate scores from other ISSF matches, for coaching and development.
- 4.3 JRS Eligibility Scores will be reviewed and ratified by QAPSA Management Committee annually in consultation with the JRS Co-ordinator. Within 14 days of any changes, the Administrator will advise all clubs and the JRS Co-ordinator will advise all current Squad members.
- 4.4 JRS members must have an understanding of all aspects of the Squad Guidelines, Charters and Code of Conduct.
- 4.5 If a JRS member is under the age of 18, parents/guardian must have read and ensure the member understands all aspects of the Squad Guidelines, Charters and Code of Conduct.
- 4.6 JRS annual membership fee of \$20.00 is payable with nomination at the beginning of each squad year. Refer squad year clause 4.1
- 4.7 JRS Annual Membership fee for the first squad year is to be paid pro rata, based on date of joining within the period of 1 October to 30 September. A pro-rata fee is \$5-00 per quarter.

## **5 JRS NOMINATION**

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- 5.1 Nomination to the JRS is to be on an annual basis, current JRS members are required to re-qualify and re-nominate prior to each squad year.
- 5.2 Eligible members wishing to participate in the JRS may request a Nomination Form and Guidelines from the JRS Co-ordinator, QAPSA Administrator or from the QAPSA Web site. Refer Nomination form Appendix E.
- 5.3 Nomination and applicable fee is to be forwarded to the JRS Co-ordinator with completed score verification and Parent/Guardian Consent form (If applicable).
- 5.4 It is at the discretion of JRS Management to refuse or withdraw an invitation of membership at any time. Decision to be ratified by QAPSA Management Committee. Refusal or withdrawal from the JRS by Management must be provided in writing from QAPSA Management Committee to the member concerned, and parents/guardian if applicable.
- 5.5 If a JRS member challenges the refusal or withdrawal from JRS he/she can lodge an appeal with the QAPSA Board in writing. The QAPSA Board must respond to the challenge in writing within a reasonable time frame.

## **6 JRS Training Camps Finance**

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- 6.1 Cost for QAPSA approved ISSF JRS Training/Coaching camps may be provided as follows:
  - 6.1.1 QAPSA approved JRS Training/Coaching camps may require a minimum Registration Fee from each member attending a camp. This fee, when applicable is to be advised a minimum of 4 weeks prior to the relevant camp.
  - 6.1.2 Additional cost may be provided through QAPSA or other sources, within the means of a budget.
  - 6.1.3 Some additional cost may be required at JRS members' own expense. However, the approximate cost must be advised to the members a minimum of 4 weeks prior to the relevant camp.

## **7 Non - JRS/QAPSA Training Camps or Competitions**

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- 7.1 It is possible that some JRS members may be able to attend or participate in other Training Camps or Competitions not being conducted by QAPSA or JRS. For example through the Australian Shooting Association (ASA), Pistol Australia Incorporated (PAI) or other State Associations. Participation by JRS members at these camps or competitions will be subject to one or more of the following;
  - 7.1.1 QAPSA Management Committee and JRS Management approval.
  - 7.1.2 Specific requirements set by the invitee/organiser of the camp or competition.
  - 7.1.3 Funding requirement set by the invitee/organiser of the camp or competition.
  - 7.1.4 QAPSA and or JRS funding availability.
  - 7.1.5 Performance ability of current JRS members.
  - 7.1.6 Specific Selection Competition may be organised to determine those eligible to attend a specific camp or competition. Guidelines and timing of these selections must be advised in writing to the JRS members a minimum of 4 week prior.
  - 7.1.7 QAPSA Management Committee and JRS Management retain the right to make selections that they feel will be in the best interest to JRS and the Association, taking in to consideration clause 7.1.1 to 7.1.7.

## **8. JRS MEMBER Obligation and Code of Conduct**

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- 8.1 JRS Members have an obligation and commitment to the Queensland Amateur Pistol Shooting Association Inc.(QAPSA) and the National affiliated body Pistol Australia Inc (PAI) in their conduct and behaviour, therefore it is important that all JRS members understand and comply with the following Code of Conduct;
- 8.1.1 JRS members must at all time apply all aspects of Firearms safety, obey instructions, and commands by Range Staff, JRS Co-ordinator, Coaches and Managers,
- 8.1.2 JRS members must act in a positive and responsible manner through the display of control and respect, towards all within the sport including Co-ordinators, Coaches, Managers, parents and spectators.
- 8.1.3 JRS members must be willing to show commitment and act in a positive and responsible manner towards other JRS members by respecting the various levels of ability and goals of each member.
- 8.1.4 JRS members must understand all aspects of the Squad/Team Guidelines and Charter and comply with all relevant regulations stated.
- 8.1.5 JRS members must accept responsibility for their actions and display high standards in language, manner, punctuality, preparation and presentation, as well as encouraging all others to demonstrate the same qualities.
- 8.1.6 JRS members must refrain from any form of harassment or bullying, including verbal, physical and emotional abuse by treating everyone equally regardless of ability, age, sex, religion, ethnic origin, or disability.
- 8.1.7 JRS members are to respect that all members are deserving of equal attention and opportunities, and must refrain from disrupting, interrupting or interfering with other member's equipment or participation in JRS activities.
- 8.1.8 JRS members whilst attending JRS or other QAPSA/PA/ASA activities must wear appropriate clothing, in particular whilst on a shooting range adhering to the ISSF rules 8.4.7 to 8.4.7.2.5. Refer Appendix C. With particular emphasis on the following ISSF clauses:
- 8.4.7.2.1 Women are required to wear dresses, skirts, divided skirts, shorts or trousers, and blouses and tops (which will cover the front and back of the body, and be over each shoulder).*
- 8.4.7.2.2 Men are required to wear full-length trousers or shorts and long or short sleeved shirts.*
- 8.4.7.2.3 Shorts may not be shorter than the athlete's fingertips when the arms and fingers are extended at the athlete's side.*
- 8.4.7.2.4 Sweaters or cardigans may be worn.*
- 8.1.9 Any JRS Member that does not comply with any of the clauses 8.1.1 to 8.1.8 may be immediately withdrawn from JRS and could be liable for further disciplinary actions by QAPSA Management and or QAPSA Board or the law enforcement

## 10. JRS Co-ordinator Charter

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- 9.1 The State ISSF JRS Co-ordinator shall comply with and be responsible for:
- 9.1.1 Ensuring they have up to date Category H Licence and Queensland “Blue Card”
  - 9.1.2 Ensuring they hold a minimum of Pistol Australia Inc (PAI) Level 1 Coach accreditation
  - 9.1.3 The formation of the ISSF Junior Rookie Squad (JRS), in accordance with QAPS JRS Policy of Membership Eligibility.
  - 9.1.4 Referring all nominations for JRS membership, with recommendations to JRS Management for endorsement, including ensuring all JRS eligible criteria have been met.
  - 9.1.5 Ensure that an annual plan and budget is developed in a timely manner for presentation to the QAPSA Executive/Board, and provide annual input to the QAPSA 5 year rolling plan.
  - 9.1.6 Complying with all administrative requirements by QAPSA Administrator and QAPSA Management Committee in reference to JRS administration.
  - 9.1.7 Collecting and recording all JRS members scores from open competitions, camp control matches and when possible club competitions.
  - 9.1.8 Ensuring that firearms safety is complied with at all time.
  - 9.1.9 Conducting themselves in a responsible manner towards all JRS members and respect the various levels of ability and goals of each member.
  - 9.1.10 JRS Co-ordinator must be mindful of physical contact with juniors and ensure they and others comply with the ASA Members protection policy. The ASA Member protection policy is available on the ASA Website or from the QAPSA administrator and will be updated from time to time.
    - 9.1.10.1 JRS Co-ordinator must be familiar and adhere to the **Child Protection “Good Practice”** Guidelines. Refer Appendix D.
  - 9.1.11 Ensuring that all JRS members understand and comply with the JRS Policy and Guidelines “Code of conduct” Clause 8.1.1 to 8.1.9
  - 9.1.12 Organising JRS training camps to promote coaching, motivation and shoulder-to-shoulder competition, within a means of a QAPSA approved budget
  - 9.1.13 Securing written parental consent when conducting JRS authorised training camps for the organisation to act in *loco parentis*, to give permission for the administration of emergency first aid or other medical treatment if the need arises. Refer Appendix B
  - 9.1.14 Submitting a budget to QAPSA Management Committee for any proposed Training and Coaching camp, a minimum of 2 months in advance of the intended camp. Budget, activities and outsourced coaches etc, must be approved by QAPSA Management Committee and the budget must include details of;
    - (a) Approximate number of attendees including names of the JRS members.
    - (b) Venue of proposed camp
    - (c) Provisional agenda and activities
    - (d) Information about any outsourced coaches or specialist is attending.

- 9.1.15 Providing detailed reports to QAPSA Management Committee on any camps conducted no later than 30 days after the conclusion of the camp, report to include;
- (a) Expenditure (with receipts)
  - (b) Outcome from the overall camp
  - (c) Individual performance by JRS members worth noting
  - (d) General behaviour by JRS members
- 9.1.16 Bringing to the attention of QAPSA Management Committee any misbehaviour by JRS members attending camps or at general club activities.
- 9.1.17 Providing all necessary information to JRS members as they arise, including parents (when applicable).
- 9.1.18 Recognise that some JRS members may have a “Personal Coach”, thus coaching activities in some instances should be discussed with the “Personal Coach” prior to commencement of i.e. a JRS Camp.
- 9.1.19 Maintaining contact and continued encouragement with all JRS members.
- 9.1.20 Ensuring that within reason all JRS members, coaches and staff set an example of complying with the appropriate ISSF dress code in particular whilst on a shooting range. Refer appendix C for the ISSF rules 8.4.7 to 8.4.7.2.5. Particular emphasis should be placed on the following ISSF clauses:
- 8.4.7.2.1** *Women are required to wear dresses, skirts, divided skirts, shorts or trousers, and blouses and tops (which will cover the front and back of the body, and be over each shoulder).*
- 8.4.7.2.2** *Men are required to wear full-length trousers or shorts and long or short sleeved shirts.*
- 8.4.7.2.3** *Shorts may not be shorter than the athlete’s fingertips when the arms and fingers are extended at the athlete’s side.*
- 8.4.7.2.4** *Sweaters or cardigans may be worn.*

## EXTRACT FROM ISSF Clothing Regulation

### 8.4.7 Clothing Regulations

- 8.4.7.1** It is the responsibility of the competitor to appear on the ranges dressed in a dignified manner appropriate to a public event.
- 8.4.7.2** During the Competitions and Pre-Event Training:
- 8.4.7.2.1** Women are required to wear dresses, skirts, divided skirts, shorts or trousers, and blouses and tops (which will cover the front and back of the body, and be over each shoulder).
  - 8.4.7.2.2** Men are required to wear full-length trousers or shorts and long or short sleeved shirts.
  - 8.4.7.2.3** Shorts may not be shorter than the athlete's fingertips when the arms and fingers are extended at the athlete's side.
  - 8.4.7.2.4** Sweaters or cardigans may be worn.
  - 8.4.7.2.5** Tracksuits supplied to the team as official uniform will be permitted.
  - 8.4.7.2.6** All members of one team, men or women, should be dressed in a similar team top.
  - 8.4.7.2.7** During the Award or other Ceremonies the athletes are required to present themselves in their official national uniform or national tracksuits (tops and bottoms). All team members must be dressed in the same way.
- 8.4.7.3** The use of any special devices, means or garments which immobilize or unduly reduce the movement of the shooter's legs, body or arms, are prohibited in order to ensure that the performance skills of the shooters are not artificially improved by special clothing.
- 8.4.7.4** **Low-sided shoes** should be worn. Any high-sided type shoes (such as Rifle, Basketball, or Ski boots, etc.) which cover the ankle bone, or could give support, are not permitted. Shoes will be checked at Equipment Control. Clothing will be checked on the firing line.
- 8.4.7.5** **Bib (Start) Numbers** must be worn by all shooters, on their backs and above the waist, at all times while participating in pre-event training and competition. If the Bib (Start) Number is not worn, the shooter may not commence/continue.
- 8.4.7.6** ALL SHOOTERS MUST COMPLY with the ISSF Eligibility and Sponsorship Rules (Section 4 of the Official Statutes Rules and Regulations). This Section covers the rules to compete in ISSF competitions and such matters as: Emblems, Sponsorship, Advertising and Commercial Marking of Clothing together with Controls and Sanctions.
- 8.4.7.7** **Side Blinders** attached to the hat, cap, shooting glasses, or to a head band, not exceeding 40 mm deep are permitted. These blinders must not extend further forward than to a line from the center of the forehead.
- 8.4.7.7.1** A piece to cover the non aiming eye not larger than 30 mm wide is permitted.

## CHILD PROTECTION “Good Practice”

### Introduction

Everyone who participates in the activities of Queensland Amateur Pistol Shooting Association (QAPSA) is entitled to do so in an enjoyable and safe environment. QAPSA has a moral and legal obligation to ensure that, when given responsibility for children, coaches and volunteers provide them with the highest possible standard of care. The aim is to promote good practice, providing children and young people with appropriate safety/protection whilst involved in the activities of QAPSA. **A child is defined as a person under the age of 18 (Children’s Act 1989)**

### Good Practice

All personnel should adhere to the following principles and action:

- ❖ Always work in an open environment (e.g. avoiding private or unobserved situations and encouraging open communication with no secrets).
- ❖ Make the experience of pistol shooting fun and enjoyable: promote fairness, confront and deal with bullying.
- ❖ Treat all children equally and with respect and dignity.
- ❖ Always put the welfare of the child first, before winning.
- ❖ Maintain a safe and appropriate distance with children (e.g. it is not appropriate for staff or volunteers to have an intimate relationship with a child or to share a room with them)
- ❖ Avoid unnecessary physical contact with children. Where any form of manual/physical support is required it should be provided openly and with the consent of the child. Physical contact can be appropriate so long as it is neither intrusive nor disturbing and the child’s consent has been given.
- ❖ Involve parents/cares wherever possible, e.g. where children need to be supervised in changing rooms, encourage parents to take responsibility for their own child. If groups have to be supervised in changing rooms always ensure parents, coaches etc work in pairs.
- ❖ Gain written parental consent for any significant travel arrangements e.g. overnight stays.
- ❖ Ensure that at away events an unaccompanied adult should not enter a child’s room or invite a child to their rooms.
- ❖ Be an excellent role model, this includes not smoking or drinking alcohol in the company of children.
- ❖ Always give enthusiastic and constructive feedback rather than negative criticism.
- ❖ Recognising the developmental needs and capacity of the child and do not risk sacrificing welfare in a desire for personal achievements. This means avoiding excessive training or competition and not pushing them against their will.
- ❖ Secure written parental consent for the organisation to act in *loco parentis*, to give permission for the administration of emergency first aid or other medical treatment if the need arises.
- ❖ Keep written record of any injury that occurs, along with details of any treatment given
